NEW YEAR PRAYER AND COMMUNION SERVICE

We recognize the essential nature of the Eucharist, which is the source and summit of our spiritual strength as Christians, and the importance of Christmas, and we want to provide an opportunity for parishioners who wish to do so, to spend time, even if briefly, at church. As we adhere to the Health and safety measures announced by the Province of Ontario, all public Masses are temporarily cancelled. We are encouraged to open our church doors for private prayer and private Eucharistic Adoration as per the schedule below, ensuring that all appropriate health and safety measures are in place (use of masks, hand sanitizer, physical distancing, etc.). Please note that only 10 persons should be in the church at one time both during the private prayer and the Communion Service which Cardinal Collins has approved. If you are staying for the "private prayer", we kindly ask that you sanitize your area once you leave (spray & cloths on credenza table as you enter the Church). Those who are coming for the "Communion Service" (10 at a time), will be asked to stand, appropriately distanced, in front of the Sanctuary, no cleaning of pews is required.
