CELEBRATION OF MASS AND OTHER LITURGIES

All Priests of the Archdiocese have been celebrating Mass every day privately for the intentions of the faithful since the pandemic began. With the help of Frank Cianni, Neriza Neville, and Frank Donato, parishioners were able to participate by joining in as we celebrated Palm Sunday, Easter Triduum, and our Sunday Masses. On April 19th, the Chaplet of the Divine Mercy was beautifully sung by Joseph Frias (Neriza's Brother), Neriza Neville, and Giselle, followed by the Celebration of Mass. On Wednesday, May 13th, the feast of Our Lady of Fatima, the Holy Rosary was prayed, followed by the Celebration of Mass. This Friday, May 22nd, Mass will be celebrated at 7:00 pm, Feast of St. Rita, an Augustinian Sister, known as the "Saint of the Impossible" and the "Peacemaker".

OTHER WAYS YOU MAY EXPERIENCE GOD'S CONNECTION

You can also watch, via live-stream, a Mass celebrated every day at 7:30 am at St. Michael's Cathedral Basilica, which will be followed by the Angelus and the Rosary. This Mass, Rosary and Angelus will also be available on the Archdiocese of Toronto's YouTube channel for those who cannot join at 7:30 am. In addition, Mass will be broadcast daily on Salt & Light Catholic Media Foundation, Vision-TV (Daily TV Mass) and EWTN.

RE-OPENING OF CHURCH AND RECTORY OFFICE

Last week, we were invited to join in two separate Webinar sessions presented by the Director of Public Relations and Communications at the Archdiocese: "Considerations for Re-opening of Parishes" and "Guidelines for Facilitating a Safe Return to Parish Offices". Some decisions will rely on the direction from Public Health, Government, and with the Assembly of Catholic Bishops for consistency. Specific issues they are working on before opening are: Capacity, Hygiene/Screening, Sacraments, Mass Considerations and Training of Volunteers, etc.

In preparation for us to return to our Spiritual life safely, we are in the process of establishing a "Re-Opening Committee" comprised of volunteers from the various parish ministries and parish groups to help implement and put forth the Diocesan Plan. The Archdiocese will keep us informed in a few weeks as plans are finalized and we will communicate to you via email and website.

Quoted from Cardinal Collins letter in which he stated the following Full letter on Website (front page):

"We expect that there will continue to be restrictions on large gatherings in the days ahead, until it is safe to resume them. There will likely be a "phased" approach, a gradual return to public celebration of the sacraments. Even then, our new reality in church may be different from what we were accustomed to in the past, with some continuing precautions, since we want to resume public gatherings in a way that does not lead to a re-igniting of the pandemic. As our province begins to consider how and when activities can commence once more, the Catholic Church is preparing for the time when we are able to re-open our churches. The Archdiocese of Toronto has established a number of working groups to determine how we will proceed. We want to ensure that everyone can worship in a safe environment. We are looking at best practices in other places, working with medical experts and consulting to determine what to do in the days ahead, recognizing the geographical and physical diversity of our more than 200 parishes."

OUR CHURCH NEEDS YOUR SUPPORT

In the next pages, please find attached the Sacred Heart Parish 2019 summary of revenue and expenses for your review. The summary shows that we had a small surplus of \$ 949.32 for the year.

We are grateful for your ongoing financial and non-financial support to our parish. Without the commitments of time, talents and donations we would not be able to provide for the spiritual and physical needs of our local Catholic community. Our contributions also play a part at all levels of our church through all the special collections we rally behind during the year.

One way to help our Parish, financially, is to consider using the Pre-Authorized Giving Program (PAG). Enrolling in this program, will provide a consistent flow of funds that will be used for ongoing operating expenses and any unforeseen circumstances. This program is especially important due to the current COVID-19 crisis and the effect it's had on the Church's finances. Even during the closure of the church, the operating costs and expenses continue to be incurred without the support of the offertory collections.

The Pre-Authorized Giving program is administered directly by the Sacred Heart parish office. Once registered in the program, you decide how much you want to contribute to the parish on a monthly basis and it is automatically withdrawn from your bank account once a month.

If you are currently enrolled in the PAG Program, your consideration to increase your contribution is greatly appreciated. 


