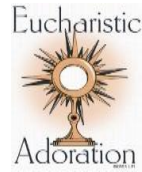

FIRST FRIDAY ADORATION

Spend a night with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament every First Friday of the month following the 7:00 PM Friday mass. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is available before Exposition. The evening consists of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, personal quiet contemplation, hymns of praise and worship, and the Rosary of the Father. Worshippers are free to join at any point throughout the night and can stay as long as they like. Saturday morning, Mass begins at 8:30 a.m.

FEAST DAYS THIS WEEK

Saint John Vianney, Tuesday, August 4th.

Patron Saint of Parish Priests and is famous for his legendary dedication to the sacrament of Confession, often spending 16-18 hours a day listening to penitents.

Transfiguration of the Lord – Thursday, August 6th

This is a vital moment in the Gospels that reveals His divine glory, bridges the Old and New Testaments, and prepares His disciples for His upcoming suffering. It stands as a pivotal event showing Jesus as both fully human and fully divine.

Saint Dominic, Saturday, August 8th.

Primarily known for founding the Order of Preachers (the Dominicans) popularizing the Rosary and emphasizing education and poverty in preaching. He dedicated his life to reforming the clergy and defending church teachings through intellectual study.
