## WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY (JANUARY 18<sup>th</sup> – 25<sup>th</sup>)

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is an ecumenical celebration that happens annually from January 18 to 25. For over a century during that week, Christians from all over the world have been praying for healing, reconciliation and the restoration of unity within the Body of Christ. Wanting to be one is not just a good idea; it's what Jesus desires. Jesus asks the Father in the Gospel of St. John that "they may all be one" (John 17:21). This year's theme is, *"There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the hope of your calling."* (Ephesians 4:4). These words of St. Paul see the unity of the community of believers as a vocation, a calling by the Holy Spirit. This unity is linked to one hope and practiced in communal support, by embracing diversity while maintaining communion. Prayer together is an act of humility, hope and love, and ultimately a divine gift leading us to deeper and fuller unity in the Body of Christ. We invite you to join **Bishop John A. Boissonneau** and distinguished Christian leaders from various traditions, as we pray together for the restoration of the full visible unity that Jesus Christ willed for His Church. All are welcome, **Sunday, January 18<sup>th</sup>, at 4:00 pm Runnymede United Church, 432 Runnymede Rd., Toronto.** The service will include Scripture, prayer, and music from various choirs from many Christian communities and ethnic groups. This is a way to show that we are all one in Christ through our common baptism.
